MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

- High School Diploma or equivalent
- A minimum of ONE year of Paramedic experience with a Fire District/Department, hospital-based, or private ambulance that routinely conducted ALS field treatment and transport services
- Possess and maintain a Washington State Paramedic certification and Snohomish County MPD approval within 90 days of hire
- Possess and maintain a current PALS and ACLS certification at time of hire (PALS requirement may be fulfilled by MPD-approved equivalent)
- Possess or ability to possess a Washington State Driver's License within 30 days of hire
- Possess or ability to possess and maintain an Emergency Vehicle Driver's Training (EVDT) certification
- Meet the District's physical qualifications and pass a background check, medical and psychological exams, and drug screening prior to appointment
- General knowledge of principles, practices, and procedures of EMS
- Maintain insurability to drive and operate a motor vehicle in Washington State
- Must be able to read, write, and speak the English language

COMMUTING REQUIREMENT

Employees of SCFD17 shall be responsible for limiting their commute on the day they are to begin shift to two-and-one-half-hours or less to the Fire District.

DEPARTMENT OVERVIEW

Snohomish County Fire District 17 (Granite Falls Fire), mere minutes from the Cascade Mountains and the Mountain Loop Highway, responded to 2,718 calls for service in 2023. With an estimated population of 14,952, SCFD17 strongly supports its community through fire prevention and public education services, positive engagement, school visits, CPR and First Aid training, blood pressure checks, address plate distribution, smoke alarm installation, and station tours/visits.



Located approximately 17 miles from Everett, the largest city in Snohomish County, SCFD17 provides safe, efficient and cost-effective professional response to the emergency and non-emergency needs of those within the 50.5 square mile service area, and adjacent districts under Interlocal Agreements, With two fully-staffed stations, continuing to build upon our Single-Role Paramedic program is a natural and exciting next step for the District.

Operational staffing currently includes:

- 3 Chief Officers and 1 Administrative Lieutenant
- 3 Captains and 12 career Firefighter/EMTs
- 4 career Single-Role Paramedics
- Approx. 24 part-time personnel
- One office assistant
- Additional volunteers, including chaplaincy and support services

AREA INFORMATION
